HOLY COMMUNION UNDER BOTH KINDS

The Bishops of England & Wales have decided to make the receiving of the Precious Blood from the Chalice permitted, at the discretion of the Parish Priest. Therefore, the Chalice is available to you once more, if there is a Eucharistic Minister at Mass This of course is not obligatory, but allowed once more. For obvious reasons, people must feel free to receive Holy Communion via the host only, as this contains the full presence of the Lord, body, blood, soul and divinity. Many will prefer to continue in this way due to increased risk of cross contamination, so please be cautious. Finally, the Bishops repeat their view that the practice of "intinction" (dipping the host into the precious blood) by yourself is not a recommended method of **RECEIVING** Holy Communion. Though quite common abroad, the Bishops here do not offer the option, and request visitors to respect this. In our parish we will resume the practice of receiving the Chalice on the sanctuary. More immobile parishioners can let us know in advance and arrangements can be made.

The second collection this Sunday 30th April is for the *Clergy Training Fund*. Our prayers this Sunday are also for vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate and the religious life.
