## POPE FRANCIS' MESSAGE FOR COP28

"Today, the world needs alliances that are not against anyone, but in favour of all," he said. "It is urgent that religions, without falling into the trap of syncretism, give a good example. Working together, not for one's own interests or those of one party, but for the interests of our world." He added that the most important topics currently are "peace and the climate." Pope Francis thus invited all religious representatives to be an example and "show that change is possible" by bearing witness to sustainable and respectful lifestyles.
