REFLECTION

Our thoughts and prayers today centre on the theme of wisdom. To be wise has little to do with being intelligent and nothing to do with being smart. It means knowing what is right from God's point of view. But we all act foolishly at times. We confess our foolishness to God who is wise and all understanding.

Wisdom is a gift from God. It means that we put our trust in his word rather than in human wisdom. It gives us an understanding, a vision of life that cannot be bought. In this sense then, wisdom is the pearl of great price. Our tragedy as believers is not that we cannot find the pearl (it is offered to us in the gospels) but that we are unwilling to pay the price for it. Wisdom calls for our total response and full-hearted action. The pearl is offered to those who open their hands, letting go of all other things and embrace it.

PLEASE PRAY FOR VOCATIONS

All of us are on a journey – from our conception until death – and beyond. We continually move forward on that journey of our life. We need to place our hands in God's to keep us in paths that are safe.

In our relationship with God, we are called like children to a deeper sense of trust in Him. As the Good Shepherd ,Christ invites us to follow Him, to rely upon Him in order that we grow in freedom and be led to green pastures. Certainly, we need to take time to listen, look, slow down, reflect and go beyond our superficial desires. Each of us needs time to realise that God may be (in fact he most certainly is) calling each and every one of us daily! As Jesus said come, follow me.
