REFLECTION ON THE BEATITUDES

At the World Youth Day in 2014, Pope Francis talked about and urged everyone to use the revolutionary power of the Beatitudes as a central point of reference in their lives. Jesus proclaimed them in his first great sermon. What does Jesus tell us? He shows us the way to life, the way that he himself has taken. Jesus himself is the way, and he proposes this way as the path to true happiness. In proclaiming the Beatitudes, Jesus asks us to follow him and to travel with him along the path of love, the path that alone leads to eternal life. It is not an easy journey, yet the Lord promises us his grace and he never abandons us. We face so many challenges in life, but if we open the door to Jesus and allow him to be part of our lives, if we share our joys and sorrows with him, then we will experience the peace and joy that only God, who is infinite love, can give. The Beatitudes of Jesus present a model of happiness contrary to what is usually communicated by the media and by the prevailing wisdom. Jesus challenges us to take seriously his approach to life and to decide which path is right for us and leads to true joy. This is the great challenge of faith. Jesus was not afraid to ask his disciples if they truly wanted to follow him. Simon Peter had the courage to reply: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (In 6:68). If we too are able to say "yes" to Jesus, our lives will become both meaningful and fruitful.
